

What's in the Bag with Jono Van Rensburg

This vibrant young rising star has played some fantastic golf over the past 6 months and I decided to have a chat with him to share some light on what his secret recipe is! Now for the young members in the club that do not know who Jono Van Rensburg is; some pictures to refresh your memories:



Jono Van Rensburg, AKNA The Putt King, has a very unique way of playing golf and the saying: “ Luckily there is no space on the scorecard for comments” really apply to this phenomenal talented player. Now to get back to the article, what is in the bag with Jono Van Rensburg?

First and foremost he has 2 putters in his bag. The one normal putter people use on the green and then his driving putter. This is his ‘go to’ club and according to him he can hit this club between 1 yard and 200 yards, depending on the amount of sleep he had the previous night... Then he has his Taylormade RBZ 3-wood (he calls this club his pet shop slanngetjie club) which he only uses to clear the rough around his ball before he return to his go to club; his driving putter. He does have a Cobra driver in his bag, not alot of light was shared on this club and I can only recall something in the line of: “ I have seen alot of players with this club in their bag, so I purchased one as well to make my bag look good.

He does own a Lob wedge, but could not answer me on what degrees and what bounce the wedge is, because he never knew there was such wide variety of options.
